Subject: Progress Report on the 6th Batch of Scholars in Footwear Training (Aug 2023 - June 2024)

Date: September 3, 2023

5th Batch of Scholars

Twenty scholars from the fifth batch completed their training on May 30 and graduated on June 9, 2023. Out of them, eight have successfully earned the shoe craftsmanship certificate. The remaining 12 trainees are encouraged to continue practicing and retake the assessment once they feel ready to obtain their shoe craftsmanship certificate.

Regional shoe retailers have already started collaborating with some of them in developing samples to order. Some individuals have acquired jobs in malls, yet they still visit our facility to work on their shoe and leather products during their spare time. We are delighted to offer our assistance in developing their products for sale.



Arthel Jade Cuaresma – One of the eight students who received the shoe craftsmanship Certificate is already collaborating with local weavers and bead workers to produce sandals using materials like pineapple fibers, Tinalak, that are indigenous to the region.





Patricio Basan, a graduate from the fifth batch, has utilized the leather goods training he received to secure orders for refurbishing lineman's safety harnesses. He has already submitted his prototype for safety testing and intends to collaborate with other graduates to produce the harnesses once he receives the orders. Seen below



New Batch of Scholarship Recipients

This report outlines the selection and orientation of the new batch of scholars that embarked on a 10-month training course. The course aims to equip these scholars with the skills, Knowledge, and exposure necessary for their future careers in shoemaking. A total of 8 scholars from diverse backgrounds were selected to undergo this comprehensive training program from August 2023 to May 2024.

Course Duration

• Ten months (from August 2023 to June 2024)

Target Audience

- Out-of-School youths from Low-Income Families Interested in Footwear Manufacturing
- Women from Underrepresented Communities Pursuing Footwear Manufacturing
- Unemployed individuals who want to career in shoe making

Methodology for Selection

The scholars had undergone a rigorous, multi-step process that included:

- 1. Application Review
- 2. Written Assessments
- 3. Interview Rounds

Demographics

- Total Selected: 8
- Gender: 5 male, three female
- Age Range: 21-39

Curriculum Overview

Our 10-month footwear design and manufacturing program is structured into two distinct semesters, each designed to offer comprehensive training in various aspects of shoemaking.

Semester 1: Fundamentals of Shoemaking

In the first semester, students will receive foundational knowledge and hands-on experience in the following areas:

- Basic Shoe Terminology and Design Principles
- Foot Anatomy and Ergonomics
- Materials Technology: Understanding Fabrics and Leathers
- Patternmaking for Footwear
- Prototyping Techniques
- Machine Sewing and Stitching
- Lasting and Finishing Processes

Semester 2: Specialization and Entrepreneurial Skills

The second semester allows students to specialize in an area of shoemaking that aligns with their interests and career goals. This semester includes:

- Specialized Shoe Construction Techniques
- Customization Options and Advanced Design
- Industry Standards and Quality Control
- A project-based module that offers students the opportunity to monetize their skills

By the end of the program, students will have a solid foundational understanding of shoemaking and specialized expertise and entrepreneurial skills, enabling them to generate income in this field potentially.

Progress of Recruited Scholars:

Within a month of joining the program, this diverse group of eight scholars—from housewives to undergraduates in their early 20s to late 40s—has shown outstanding enthusiasm and quickly mastered critical footwear design skills. They've already created basic derby shoe patterns and learned various assembly techniques, displaying strong potential for future success in the shoe industry

Optimal Budget Utilization for Four scholar Vacancies

Given the unallocated budget of P. 640,000 from four vacant slots, we are eager to optimize these funds to significantly benefit more scholars and extend our impact on the larger community. To this end, we propose to launch a series of specialized, 3-month workshops to start on October to December, January 2024 to March and April to June to fill the essential training gap in the growing shoe-making community in the Region.

Course Overview

Our workshops aim to provide a comprehensive, hands-on learning experience focusing on specialized skill sets across multiple verticals in design and manufacturing. The initial series will target pattern-making and prototyping, enabling scholars to transition from design concepts to tangible prototypes.

Objective:

The workshops aim to provide a comprehensive, hands-on learning experience focusing on specialized skill sets. The initial series will target pattern-making and prototyping, enabling scholars to transition from design concepts to tangible prototypes.

Key Learning Outcomes:

- 1. Perform pattern-making techniques for various footwear styles and design visualization by the trainee.
- 2. Trainee selects the appropriate material based on project requirements.
- 3. Trainee performs basic manufacturing processes to create prototypes.

Participant Structure:

Each workshop will accommodate students from different regions of Mindanao, leading to 13 scholars benefitting from this series of workshops.

By judiciously allocating the unused Budget for these targeted, high-impact workshops, we aim to fill a critical training gap and extend meaningful contributions to the poor communities in the region.

Collaboration Across Courses

One of the unique aspects of this program is the opportunity for cross-collaboration between students at different stages of their training. Students who complete the 3-month course in pattern-making and prototyping will have the exclusive opportunity to collaborate with graduates who have finished the 10-month advanced period.

Community Outreach

In Partnership with the Department of Trade and Industry of Region 12, We conducted a comprehensive four-day training seminar in General Santos City. Attendees from various regions, including South Cotabato, General Santos, and Sarangani Province, joined us. The seminar aimed to cater to a diverse range of participants, from traditional sandal manufacturers to local artisans specializing in indigenous weaving materials. Our primary goal was to enhance the regional sandal and slipper industry by providing expert insights into modern manufacturing methods, sustainable and indigenous material usage, and quality assurance protocols.
